David Ogletree, a native of Detroit, Michigan enrolled in Tuskegee in 1976 on an athletic scholarship. He excelled at football while playing several positions: wide receiver, tight end, and punter. Some of his accomplishments include: being named team captain during 1978, 1979, and 1980 seasons; ALL SIAC football in 1978 and 1980 seasons; team MVP; and two-time 100% Wrong Club (Atlanta, Georgia) award recipient.

Ogletree majored in Communication Arts at Tuskegee and was active in numerous campus activities. Ogletree subsequently graduated from Tuskegee University in 1981 with a Bachelor of Arts degree.
