Kenneth Crum, a native of Greenville, Alabama, enrolled at Tuskegee Institute on a four-year football scholarship in 1979. Under the coaching and mentorship of the late Haywood Scissum, Crum became starting quarterback and was named Freshman of the Year (1979). He lettered in consecutive seasons through 1982 and led the Golden Tigers in several winning seasons during his tenure on the team.

A Business Administration major, Crum earned his Bachelor of Science degree in 1984. While at Tuskegee, Crum participated in a Christian Bible Study Organization (*The Navigators*).

After completing his degree at Tuskegee, Crum subsequently obtained a position at Kaiser Permanente Hospital as Environmental Services Supervisor. He later transitioned to the travel industry, working with Continental Airlines, where he gained experience that helped him establish his own travel agency in 1990. Crum's travel agency has provided a wide range of travel services to well-known corporate institutions and renowned individuals such as Millie Jackson, Michael Jackson, and Frankie Beverly and Maze. Currently, Crum coordinates travel exclusively for Minister Louis Farrakhan and the Nation of Islam.

Crum's community involvement has included clothing and feeding the homeless in downtown Los Angeles, outreach in the Metro Atlanta prison system, and other continued service efforts through the Nation of Islam.
