Maurice Evans, a native of Atlanta, Georgia enrolled at Tuskegee University on a four-year athletic scholarship in football in 1983. A quarterback, he lettered all four years, and was promoted to starter for the 1983 Turkey Day Classic. Maurice was selected as team captain in 1984. In 1987, with his on-the-field career complete, Maurice served as the quarterback coach for the SIAC Golden Tiger Championship team.

As a Management Science major, Maurice served as President of the Society for Advancement of Management Organization and was a member of the Visiting Executive Committee. Maurice also served as the Dorm President for Residence B his freshman year, and he worked in the office of Grants Management for two years.

Over the last 25 years, Maurice's career has flourished as an employee relations expert directing operations in Mexico, Costa Rico, El Salvador and throughout the United States. Maurice has served as Director of Human Resources for several major corporations which include: West Point Pepperell, Champion Products, Sara Lee Bakery, Grainger, Jackmont Hospitality, and presently with Integral. In 2013, Maurice was recognized as "Human Resources Visionary of the Year" by Transitions Optical and was featured on the cover of the national publication Employee Benefit News.

Maurice has been nationally recognized as the Manager and Coach of "Team Atlanta", the most decorated 3 on 3 hoops team in the history of the game. Maurice was presented the 2008 Lifetime Achievement Award by All-City Sports Marketing. Team Atlanta won the nationally televised Hoop it Up World Tour in 1995, 1998 and 1999. Maurice currently serves as the Board Chair for the South DeKalb YMCA where he provides guidance over a 2 million dollar equipment, program and personnel budget. In 2013 Maurice was honored by the Metro Atlanta YMCA as the "Volunteer of the Year". Maurice is a member of the 100 Black Men of DeKalb County, and past Board Chair for DeKalb County CASA.

Maurice has consistently supported Tuskegee University as a member of the Atlanta-Tuskegee Alumni Club, and plays an important role in the Annual Homecoming Golf Classic. His son, Maurice "Trey" Evans, III is a senior at Tuskegee University.
