Clarence Edward Jackson, Detroit, Michigan was a member of the baseball team from 1921 to 1924 in the position of catcher and later serving as captain.

In describing the beginning of baseball practice for the spring of 1924, the Tuskegee Student described the baseball season under Coach Cleveland Abbott as the best year ever with such expressions as 'Hit the dirt' or 'This is our year' with his fellow athletes James E. Boss and Eddie Woolridge

Upon graduation he became head coach at Snow Hill Institute (Alabama) and operated a shoe repair service in Selma, Alabama. He continued with this profession to Detroit, Michigan, later serving as business agent for the AFL-CIO until 1980.

He continues to serve as scout master for the Boy Scouts of America, Troop 244, and other community and civic organizations in Detroit.
