Frederick C. Rodgers, Outstanding Athlete, Coach, Educator and Community leader, played football at Tuskegee University from 1959-1963. From the position of tight end this "Mighty Golden Tigers", earned letters, jackets and sweaters for his stellar performance on the field of play. After graduation from Tuskegee in 1963 with his Bachelor of Science Degree Rodgers continued academic and professional career earning masters degree from Texas State in 1970 and Ed.D from Nova University in 1980.

Rodgers began his professional career as teacher/coach at Douglas Senior High School, Pittsburgh, Texas, His steady climb up to becoming a principal at Southridge Senior High School saw him teaching and coaching in many cities. Because of his extra ordinary ability to develop rapport with his students and players, and his willingness to work beyond the call of duty, he was able to succeed in the educational arena.
