A native of Columbus Georgia, Glover A. Jones enrolled at Tuskegee University on a four-year academic/athletic scholarship. Although his athletic prowess in football and tennis earned him recognition during his high school years, after one year at Tuskegee, he chose to play only football. Tennis however, remained a life-long recreational activity. He excelled on the field of play and in the classroom, lettered all four years and was co-captain of the team for two years. Jones received the R. R. Moton Award for academic excellence and leadership his senior year. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Chemistry with honors in 1962 and immediately accepted a Carver Research Fellowship for Graduate Study and Research in Physical Chemistry with the Department of the Navy, completing his Masters degree in 1966.

Jones was employed with several research facilities during his professional career, retiring as Research Scientist with E.I Dupont DeNemours & Company, Inc. He has authored and co-authored more than fifty professional publications.

Jones is affiliated with an impressive list of community, professional and service organizations. He has received numerous awards and citations appropriate to his level of participation and service to those organizations. Included is membership in the American Chemical Society and the American Crystallographic Association.

Jones is humble by his accomplishment while at Tuskegee and after graduation.
