Maurice M. Crump, Sr., an outstanding Golden Tiger lettered in football and baseball while at Tuskegee. He was All-Conference Honorable Mention in 1965, All Conference First Defensive End 1966, 1967 and 1968 in football. He was drafted as a free agent with the Pittsburg Steelers in 1969. Crump's prowess as an athlete continued on the baseball field as he was awarded letters for his performance each of the three years that he played. Not only did Crump perform well on the playing fields at Tuskegee, he was an excellent student who achieved academic honor roll status and maintained it for three years, 1966-1968. He graduated from Tuskegee University in 1969 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Building and Construction Science.

Since graduating from Tuskegee, Crump has worked in the area of construction and residential building and construction management in Durham, North Carolina, Washington, DC. Northern Virginia, New York, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and Boston, Massachusetts. He has more the 30 years of experience in the areas of Construction Management, Construction Cost Estimation and Engineering Consultant. He spent 19 years as owner and President of C&C Enterprises, his own North Carolina based construction firm.

While Crump has been actively involved as a professional in the business world he has taken time to become involved in the communities in which he lived. His commitment to community service manifested itself in his desire to work with young people and to work in the public interest. He has been a Cub and Boy Scout Leader, a Mentor, a Junior Varsity Volunteer Football Coach for Warren County (VA) High School and a Little League Baseball Coach.
