Raymond E. Johnson, Jr., outstanding athlete, educator, and community leader. While at Tuskegee he earned four letters in track and four letters in football between 1930 and 1934, and served as captain of the track team in 1933-34.

His interest and support of athletics reign throughout his lifetime. He is an excellent golfer, earning many trophies and awards. Raymond Johnson was instrumental in getting a national football rule changed on how the safety is awarded. He officiated football, track and baseball at the high school and college levels for over thirty years.

He is a retired high school teacher and coach, and government employee. His many awards and recognitions include induction into the Phyllis Wheatly High School Hall of Fame, golfers awards for three holes in one, Golden Nugget Award and trophy, 1973 Alumni Merit Award, trophy and certification of recognition by the Honorable Mickey Leland of Texas, and Certificate of Recognition from the Honorable Mayor Kathryn J. Whitmire of Houston.

He is a trustee, steward, Sunday School Superintendent, Adult Bible teacher at Mt. Vernon United Methodist Church, and an active member of the Tuskegee Alumni Club.
