



ROBERT L. MUNGIN
Class of 1953

Robert L. Mungin, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, was a member of the football team at Tuskegee from 1949 to 1953. In 1949, his freshman year, he scored the winning touchdown against Alabama State University. In 1952, he had the three longest runs from scrimmage - 65 yards against Dillard University, 58 yards against Clark College, and 53 yards against Morehouse. He was the leading scorer that year, responsible for 10 touchdowns, and was named "All Conference."

Upon graduation from Tuskegee in 1953, Mungin became teacher-coach at East Highland High School, Sylacauga, Alabama. In 1955, he moved to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and became teacher-coach at the Fifth Avenue High School, where he remained until 1964. From 1964 to 1966 he served in various positions - Counselor, Neighborhood Youth Corps; Supervisor, Neighborhood Youth Corps and Federal Programs; Principal, Larimer Elementary School; and Principal, Belmar Elementary School. He is currently owner of Broadcrest Enterprises. In 1967 he was awarded the Master of Arts Degree in Counseling from Duquesne University, and has done further study at the University of Pittsburgh.

At Tuskegee, Mungin was a Distinguished Military Student; Commissioned Second Lieutenant, Infantry ROTC; and served a tour of duty in the United States Army.

He continues to be actively involved in community affairs in Pittsburgh. Mungin is a member of the Sixth Mt. Zion Baptist Church; President of the Tuskegee University Alumni Association; Member, National Education Association, the Pittsburgh Administrator's Association, Catholic High School Athletic Association; Board of Directors, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, and the Free and Accepted Masons, Prince Hall Affiliate. He is Program Director and Football Coach, Lincoln-Larimer Athletic Association; and coach, Little League Baseball, Shady Side Boys' Club.
