Thomas L. Delton, Ft. Valley, Georgia, was a member of the football and track teams at Tuskegee, and received letters in both. In 1936 he placed second on the second All-American team in football.

During his performance on the track field, he set numerous records including the 440 sprint. He participated and received numerous awards at the Penn, Prairie View and Xavier Relays.

He continued his studies at the Command and Staff College, Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas, the Universities of Georgia and Wisconsin.

Since 1937, Delton has held many positions beginning as Vocational Agriculture teacher, Toomsboro, Georgia; Farmers Home Administration Office, USDA, Sparta, Georgia; Vocational Agriculture Teacher, Crawfordsville, Georgia; Rural Community Development Specialist, USDA, Washington, DC; Equal Employment Opportunity Program Officer, at Robbins Air Force Base, GA.

Among his awards and citations are the Department of Agriculture Distinguished Award, the Air Force Distinguished Service Award and the National Professional Agriculture Award.
