

Pastor Arthur Lee Jackson, Sr. Class of 1981

Arthur Lee Jackson, Sr., a native of Espanola, FL, graduated from Flagler Palm Coast High School and enrolled at Tuskegee Institute in 1975 on a partial baseball Scholarship. Jackson was allowed to walk on and try out for the football team. He later became a starter, and subsequently was named First Team All-Conference Split End. In 1980, Jackson earned the Tuskegee Scholastic Football Trophy for having the highest GPA on the team.

Jackson majored in Physical Therapy at Tuskegee and was also active in the Tuskegee University Sunday School – Navigator Ministry. He received Jesus Christ on Tuskegee's campus, in the Martin Luther King, Jr. Commons Room, when the Navigators Ministry shared the gospel of Jesus Christ with him.

Jackson received a B.S. Degree in Physical Therapy in 1981 and subsequently earned an Associate Degree in Biblical Studies from Vision International University, where he served 18 years at Living Faith Christian Center, teaching "Greek" in their Bible College. He currently works as a Physical Therapist and was awarded a Humanitarian Award in 2009.

Jackson is an ordained minister, Founder and Senior Pastor of Living Faith Christian Center in Florida. He is a Tuskegee University Sunday School Alumni member, Carver Alumni Association member and was recently selected by the George Washington Carver Alumni Association as the 2019 Outstanding Community Service Awardee, given to individuals who mentor young men and provide continuous leadership to the community.

Pastor Jackson and his wife of 38 years, Gwen (Class of 81), Elem. Ed., support Tuskegee University during homecoming by giving back to the Chapel through Tuskegee Sunday School Alumni and also he supports the Skegee Golden Tigers Memorial Football Scholarship Fund.
