Dr. Stephanie Davis, a native of Thomasville GA, enrolled at Tuskegee University (TU) on a four year basketball scholarship in 1990. She lettered two years as a point guard and for one year in volleyball. She was selected for the 1992 Sonya "Cookie" Kennedy Academic Scholarship as the Golden Tigerette with the highest GPA.

Dr. Davis majored in Animal Science and Pre-Veterinary Medicine while attending Tuskegee University. She was selected to conduct research at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and won National Veterinary Public Health Student of the Year. She is a founding member of Golden Key National Honor Society at TU and VP of Gamma Tau Chapter-Delta Sigma Theta, Inc. She also earned an AFROTC scholarship and received a 2nd LT Commission during her tenure at Tuskegee.

Dr. Davis' path to excellence continued in her professional career as an Air Force (AF) Public Health Officer. She earned her Doctor of Medicine from Northwestern University in 2006. Post medical school, she returned to the AF to complete a family medicine residency. There, her PTSD research led to a Residency Research Award. She became a flight surgeon, then completed a Residency in Aerospace Medicine program, before earning her Master of Public Health from Yale in 2012. Dr. Davis is triple board certified.

Dr. Davis is active in community, professional, and spiritual organizations. Among them are American College of Occupational & Environmental Medicine, American Society of Aerospace Medicine and Aerospace Medicine Specialists, American Academy of Family Physicians, The Links, Inc. and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. She regularly attends Base Chapel.

Dr. Davis is a consistent supporter of Tuskegee University donating over \$16,000.00 as a member of the Dayton Tuskegee Alumni Club and the Presidential Eminent Associate Program.
