Willie H. Lampley, a native of Brundidge, Alabama, enrolled at Tuskegee Institute as a freshman walk-on athlete in 1978. By excelling on the football field and in the classroom, Lampley earned a full athletic scholarship by the end of his first season. He was later selected to the SIAC All Conference Football defensive team for two consecutive seasons (1981-1982), and served as team captain in 1982. Lampley credits his football achievements to the leadership and guidance of great coaches: Haywood Scissum, Lonzo Bullie, Wiley Lucas, and Seth Cartwright. He also gives special acclaim to his older brother, Joe N. Lampley, who was a "Golden Tiger" from 1972-1974.

Lampley earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Agribusiness from Tuskegee University in 1983. He continued his educational development by earning a Master of Education in Agriculture Education from Alabama A & M University in 1985.

Lampley has been employed as County Extension Coordinator (Sumter County) with the Alabama Cooperative Extension System for 33 years. He is thankful for the opportunity to serve the youth and adults in Alabama's Black Belt his entire professional career.
