Warren Reynolds, Dothan, Alabama, graduated from Carver High School where he was active in track, baseball, basketball and football. He was one of the "Ten Tall Men" who made up Carver High School's basketball team, one of the southeast regions most powerful high school teams. Reynolds athletic prowess continued as he entered the Golden Tigers arena where he played three sports, football, baseball and basketball and lettered in each of them.

Reynolds spent most of his professional career coaching high school and college basketball. He took his North Carolina A&T University basketball team to the National Invitational Tournament in Madison Square Garden (1974), and a year later coached A&T in the Holiday Festival Tournament in New York City. He was three times a mid Atlantic Conference Tournament coach, mid Eastern coach of the year, CIAA coach of the year and is the recipient of the Outstanding Service in Physical Education Award from Tuskegee University. Players from teams coached by Reynolds excelled in college and professional baseball, basketball and football - Elmo Smith (Los Angeles Lakers), Julius Adams (New England Patriots).
