

CECIL LEONARD Class of 1969

Cecil Leobard, Birmingham, Alabama, was a member and captain of the footbell beam, 1967-69. He received many honors in the Southern Intercollegizar Altheir Conference as well as being the Most Valuable Player in the 1968 TU/Alabama State game by kicking the winning field goal for a score of 23-5.

After graduation from Tuskegee be joined the New York Jess from 1969-1971 and later went to the Lost Angeles Bams. He continued with professional football by being a sembler of the Burninghaus Americans in 1974.

He served as recreational specialist for the city of Tuskeges and as parttime coaching assistant at Tuskeges. He went on to become one of the winningest high school coaches in the state of Alabama from Hayes High in Birmiogham and later to Parker High in the same city.

He has commissently participated in the little 6A Playoff resulting in championships or victoriese defeats.

Mr. Leonard served as president of the Alabama High School Couches Association and has received many homes from the Birmingham Four-Berald, A G. Garton Boye Cube and the Birmingham Grid Forecasters.
