Jesse B. Webb, a native of Memphis, Tennessee enrolled at Tuskegee University in August, 1962. After playing center position in football at Melrose High School, he walked on and earned a position as center and linebacker with the Tuskegee Golden Tigers. During his freshman year, he played center and linebacker in six games. He was the starting center for the remaining three years and lettered all four years. Webb was selected to the SIAC All Conference Team and named Most Valuable Offensive lineman in 1966.

Webb majored in Industrial Arts and minored in machine shop and welding. He was a charter member of Alpha Phi Omega Fraternity and the Vocational Club. He later earned certification in Career Education at the University of Georgia.

As an educator, he dedicated his professional life to the students of the Atlanta Public School System. He taught Industrial Arts for seventeen years at Coan Middle School and was the Coordinator for the Program of Education and Career Exploration (PECE) at Crim High School for fourteen years. While the Coordinator for PECE, he served as Treasurer and later President of the Atlanta Chapter of PECE (1981-1983). He was elected as Vice-President of the Georgia Association of PECE Coordinators. Additionally, he coached football, junior varsity basketball and junior varsity track. During his tenure of Crim High School, he was the offensive line coach for the Crim Eagles.

Webb is affiliated with and actively involved in community organizations, and is a member of Hillcrest Church of Christ where he works with the Usher Ministry. He tutored students in the Hillcrest After School Program and is also an active member of the Riverwood Home Association.

A strong supporter of Tuskegee University, Webb is a member of the Atlanta-Tuskegee Alumni Club, Inc.
