Outstanding athlete, coach, educator, a member of the Golden Tiger football and basketball teams. He was twice named to the SIAC All-Conference Team, and Captain of the Football Team. In 1959, against Alabama State University, he played the game after losing two upper front teeth on the opening kickoff. Stopping only to change the gauze pack, he was credited with two interceptions and seven unassisted tackles. His ability to play the whole game earned him the title "60 Minute Man." This athlete successfully combined athletics, academics and work-study while playing two sports. He made Dean's list, supervised the College Work-Study Program and was named most outstanding college student.

Dudley continued his athletic distinction after graduating from Tuskegee with the Bessemer Board of Education. He has served in home school district for over 30 years as athletic director and head football coach, head coach girls track, head basketball coach, teacher and his current position, Supervisor of Attendance and Security.

Dudley's awards and honors, include Teacher of the Year (1982), High School Coach of the Year (1965 and 1976), Outstanding Achievement Award in Education, Leadership Award, Council for School Administrators and Supervisors and many others.

While he is a busy professional, he has found time to volunteer, hold memberships and leadership roles in many organizations. Some of them are Alabama Truancy Task Force, Child Protection Team, the Jefferson County Juvenile Advisory Board, the United Negro College Fund, the American Cancer Society, the Birmingham-Tuskegee Alumni Association and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. He is also a licensed funeral director.
