

IRVIN BAULKMAN Class of 1969

An exceptional basketball player, team captain (1968-69), team's top scorer (1967 and 1969), most valuable player (1969), lettered four consecutive years. Irvin Baulkman's rose to prominence as basketball player receiving almost every recognition. When he was a starter in his senior year against Alabama State he came off the bench and scored thirty-six points, leading his team to 77-76 victory over Alabama State. Twice he was selected for tournament play - in 1967 All Alabama Tip-Off and in 1969 the Georgia Invitational Tournament.

Baulkman's athletic prowess continued after graduation through his position as Head Basketball Coach at North Miami Senior High School and Miami Central High School. In 1978 his team won the State 4-A Championship. In 1978, 1981, 1992 and 1993 he was named Coach of the Year. He was twice selected to coach All-Star Teams. He also worked as a Guidance Counselor.

His organizational and professional affiliations include President of the Miami-Tuskegee Club for two years, Chairman of the State Basketball Coaches Association, Guidance Test Chairman at Miami Central High School, Member of the Dade County Personnel Association, National Association of Black Basketball Association and Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity.
