Curtis Crump, a native of Aberdeen, Mississippi enrolled at Tuskegee University on a four-year athletic baseball scholarship in 1969. He played shortstop and lettered all four years. Crump was a first team SIAC all conference shortstop selection in 1971 and 1973. He was selected the team's co-captain in 1971, 1972 and 1973. Moreover, he was named the team's Most Valuable Player after the 1971 and 1973 seasons. In addition, he led the Golden Tigers baseball team to the NCAA Mideast Regional playoffs in 1972. In 1973 he led his team to the SIAC championship and again led the Tigers to an appearance in the NCAA Mideast Regional playoffs. Curtis earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management in 1973.

Crump's path for excellence continued in his professional career. He retired from Delphi Corporation (formerly General Motors Corporation) in October 2007. During his employment he held numerous positions in human resource management including Salaried Personnel Representative and Senior Labor Relations Representative. Additionally, he participated in Corporate Recruiting activities as a University Relations Team Member for Placement and College Relations at Tuskegee University where he recruited students for summer internships and permanent employment opportunities at General Motors Corporation.

Curtis has been an active participant in community, professional and spiritual organizations. He formerly served as head baseball coach in the Grand Blanc Little League. During his employment at Delphi he served as campaign coordinator for the United Way of Genesee, Lapeer and Shiawassee counties. He is currently a member of Five Fold Ministry Christian Center where he serves on the senior usher board.
