Reginald E. Harrison, a native of Tuskegee, Alabama enrolled at Tuskegee University on a four-year athletic scholarship in football in 1980. He lettered all four years and was the team's captain in 1981-1983 and All-SIAC Conference Linebacker 1981, 1982 and 1983. In 1983, he was named All-SIAC Lineman of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year; and Overall Player of the Year, and was an All-SIAC Scholastic Team Linebacker 1980-1983.

As an Electrical Engineering major, Reginald was an outstanding student graduating 1st in his class and making the honor roll every semester. He was a member of the National Honors Society and Who's Who in American Colleges. One of his fulfilling activities outside of TU campus life was mentoring at risk youth in the Tuskegee community. Reginald was also blessed and fortunate to be chosen as a scholar athlete to escort the first black Miss America (Vanessa Williams) when she toured the south in 1983. He subsequently earned a Master of Science degree in Electrical and Computer Engineering from the University of Maryland School of Engineering.

After graduating from Tuskegee, Reginald spent the first 10 years of his engineering career working for IBM in the Washington DC metro area where he quickly advanced to senior engineer. He received several patent and publication awards during his tenure at IBM. The next 15 to 20 years were spent in the following positions of leadership: Senior Engineer Manager and Technical lead for several private companies; Senior Engineering Manager for several DOD contracts including Army, Navy, and Marines; and Senior Cybersecurity and IT Subject Matter Expert for several government agencies including DHS/FEMA, and DOJ/FBI. Currently, he is the proud owner and CEO of REY Engineering Consulting, LLC.

Reginald is affiliated with St. Pius Church and serves on the children's choir committee. He has been involved in many charitable drives for the DC community.

He is an Eminent Associate at TU, and a contributor to the TU National Athletic Association (TUNAA). He has been a contributor to many homecoming raffles and events to support the Golden Tigers for years.
