

Alfred "Teddy" Ogden Class 1983

Alfred Ogden was born in Baxley Georgia and started his educational journey in Savannah, Ga., attending Sol C. Johnson from primary grades through high school. He lettered in 3 sports all through his high school career (Football, Basketball and Baseball).

He entered Tuskegee Institute in the fall of 1977 on a Baseball scholarship under the helm of Coach James "Big Jim" Martin. Ogden was the Batting Champ and also was selected to the First Team All-Conference in 1978-79. He also accomplished other awards in 1979-80 as SIAC Defensive Player of the Year and Tuskegee Fielding Award. In 1980-81 he was selected to the Second Team All-Conference and was also co-Batting Champ in 1980-81. Ogden was part of two SIAC Baseball Championships in 1980 and 1981. During those 4 years he was catcher for the Golden Tigers baseball team.

Ogden graduated from Tuskegee in 1983 with a B. S. degree in Physical Education. He started his career as an Educator, teaching elementary Physical Ed. for 3 years at Burke Elementary in Macon Georgia. In 1988 he returned to his Alma Mater, Sol C. Johnson as Assistant Football Coach. While teaching at Johnson, he served as Assistant Basketball and Baseball Coach. He received his first Head Boys' Basketball Coaching job in 1990 at Sparta High School in Sparta, Georgia. Ogden was then called back to become Head Boys' Basketball Coach at his alma mater, Sol C. Johnson High School. He coached for 16 years, mostly as the head boys' basketball coach.

Ogden received his Master's and Ed. S. Degrees from Cambridge College. He went on to become an Assistant Principal at Alfred E. Beach High School in Savannah, GA. He finally retired as Principal at a night school with the Savannah Chatham County Board of Education.

He supports the Tuskegee University General Fund and is a member of the Tuskegee University National Athletic Association. Ogden is also a proud member of Phi Beta Sigma Inc., Beta Kappa Chapter

Ogden has been married for 35 years to his wife, Patricia. They have two children Brandon and Kelcee, and one granddaughter Bethany. He currently resides in Baxley, Georgia.
