ALICE COACHMAN DAVIS - was a basketball and track star while at Tuskegee, in addition to being on several of Tuskegee's winning track teams, S.I.A.C conference, Tuskegee relays and the NCAA championships. She is noted most for her accomplishment in winning a Gold Medal in the Olympic games.

Since leaving Tuskegee Mrs. Davis has taught high school in Albany, Georgia and has taught on the college level at South Carolina State and Albany State Colleges. She was inducted into the Black All-American Hall of Fame during the past summer, 1974. She now resides in Albany, Georgia with her family.
