Class of 1939

Allen M. Scisco, St. Albans, New York, was a member of the football, basketball and track teams at Tuskegee from 1935 through 1939. In 1938, he served as co-captain of the football team and captain of the track and basketball teams. He was president of the "T" Club from 1938 to 1939.

He received many honors in basketball, football and track while at Tuskegee Institute. In 1936 he was pole vault champion at Xavier University, member of championship All-Southern football team, All-Southern broad jump champion, pole vault winner of South West (Texas Relays), and winner of a trophy at Xavier University Relays (9th high point man of meet).

In 1937, he was member of mile relay team at Penn Relays, All-Southern pole vault champion, and All-Southern selection in football at end.

In 1938, he led Tuskegee basketball team in scoring; member of the mile relay team at Penn Relays; entered Central Collegiate Meet in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and winner in broad jump; winner in National A.A.A.U. Junior 100 meters run at Buffalo, N.Y.; winner of 100-yard run at N.C.A.A. at Minneapolis, MN; and winner in National Decathlon Championship at New York City (first Negro to place in this event representing a Black College).

Since graduation he has been a high school teacher, director of athletics and a coach of football, basketball and track at Hasting High School, Hasting, Florida and Tuskegee Institute High School, Tuskegee, Alabama. He is a professional real estate appraiser and licensed real estate broker.

He is chairman of the board of trustees of St. Mark's Church in New York, N.Y., where he has also been director of physical education.
