Aloysious “Alley Cat” Brown, a proud native of Tuskegee, Alabama, began his journey with the Tuskegee University Golden Tigers football team in Spring 1976. As a walk-on wide receiver, he earned a full athletic scholarship in 1977. He lettered all four years of his tenure, earning the title of Team Captain in 1978. That same year, he earned recognition as a top return specialist in NCAA Division II. He developed a reputation for explosive playmaking abilities, ranking both nationally and conference-wide in kickoff and punt returns.

As a student-athlete, Brown upheld Mother Tuskegee’s principles of knowledge, leadership, and service, as he provided pivotal guidance to younger teammates. He created a legacy of mentorship as he led by example. Brown graduated from Tuskegee University in 1980 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering.

Brown has devoted his 40-year professional career as a leader in engineering, construction, and nuclear energy. He is a Certified Facility Management Administrator and Certified Project Manager. His professional career has included key roles with Bechtel Construction, Westinghouse Electric, Southern Nuclear, and Georgia-Pacific. He played an integral role in several major domestic and international projects, including the Plant Vogtle nuclear facility in Georgia. He has also successfully owned and operated his own business, further demonstrating his entrepreneurial capabilities and commitment to professional excellence.

Brown remains active in his community through Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Roswell, Georgia. He also coached successful youth football and basketball teams while instilling character in future generations.
