



ARTHUR L. "SCAD" GREEN
Class of 1933

Arthur L. (Scad) Green, Mobile, Alabama, played football at Tuskegee from 1929-1932. He was awarded a letter in 1931 and a letter and gold football award in 1932. He was a member of the T Club and the K.O.K. Club.

Following graduation from Tuskegee, he helped re-establish and develop a football program at Parker High School, Birmingham, Alabama. From 1934-1935 he was a coach and teacher at Hastings Training School in Hastings, Florida. He taught industrial arts at Rosedale High School in Birmingham from 1935-1943. From 1943-1947 he was athletic director and coach for football, basketball and track at Westfield High School in Birmingham. His football team was county champion in 1946.

From 1947-1951 he taught a printing class which served high school students during the day and veterans at night. He became vocational supervisor of the Jefferson County Training Center in Birmingham in 1951. In 1962 he was appointed as the first director of Carver State Technical School in Mobile and retired from this position in 1976.

Green was named Man of The Year, Alpha Phi Chapter, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Inc., Birmingham, in 1948 and 1957, and then again for the Rho Alpha Chapter in Mobile in 1966. In 1976 he was honored for his leadership as the first director of Carver and received the M.O. Beale Scroll of Merit from the Mobile Press-Register. He has received service awards from the Dearborn Street YMCA, Mobile and the Church of the Good Shepherd, Mobile.

In 1982 the Arthur L. Green Scholarship fund was established by the Carver State Alumni Association.
