A career teacher, counselor, coach and all Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) player in football and baseball. Carl Allen's steller performance on the playing fields brought him awards and recognitions. He lettered each of his four years in football and baseball and was named the most valuable player for his performance in the Thanksgiving Turkey Day Classic in 1951. Again, in 1951 he earned a spot in the record books with an 81 yard punt against Wilberforce University in Carmiskey Park. His talents as an athlete was not limited to one sport; in 1952, against Xavier University, he set a single game record with 22 strike outs.

After leaving the sports arena at Tuskegee in 1956, Carl Allen continued to excel. He earned two degrees from the Utah State University in Special Education (MS) and Counseling Psychology (MS) and continued his studies beyond the Masters level. His work experiences includes teacher, counselor, football-baseball coach and athletic director at Utah State Industrial Institute and as instructor of Psychology, counselor, coordinator of Upward Bound Program, board member and director of Job Corps and other federal programs.

Carl Allen has had an extensive career in academics and athletics in Utah, Indiana and Illinois.
