Charles L. Tolliver, a native of Anniston, Alabama enrolled at Tuskegee University on a Four-year Athletic scholarship in 1969. This exceptional defensive back lettered all four years, was selected to the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference all conference defensive team 1970-1972, second defensive team two years, 1969-1971, and was named team captain in 1772. Tolliver still holds the record for the longest pass interception return at Tuskegee.

As an Industrial Technology major, Tolliver became a member of the Electrotechs Club, an organization which served as a support group for students in electronic technology. He also became a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Incorporated. Tolliver earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in 1973.

Tolliver began his professional career with the General Electric Company in 1973 in the Manufacturing Management Program. Over the years he progressively advanced within the company, garnering recognition and awards along the way. In addition to his regular job responsibilities, he mentored many novice engineers and interns from around the country, including Tuskegee University. In 2008, he retired, after thirty-five years of service.

Tolliver is affiliated with several community and social organizations including the General Electric Elfun Foundation, The General Electric Quarter Century Club, and the Kentuckiana Golf Club.
