Charles U. Smith, Tallahassee, Florida, Cum Laude Graduate, End Receiver, Golden Tiger Football Team, and Member of the Basketball Team, 1943 and 1944.

On the first play of his first game in 1943 he caught the pass that won the game with Morehouse. As a member of the SIAC Championship Basketball and Football Teams, he received varsity letters in 1944.

Charles Smith was active as a student at Tuskegee, winning many awards and honors, such as the Paramount Club Prize, and the Omega Medallion of Honor for scholarship. He was a member of Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society, President of the Little Theatre, Business Manager of the Senior Class, Highest Ranking Male Scholar, and News Editor of the Campus Digest.

His outstanding performance as a student has continued throughout his life's work. He has a career of distinguished accomplishments. He is currently Graduate Dean and Professor of Sociology at Florida A&M University, and Professor of Sociology and Consultant to the Provost at Florida State University. He serves on many committees and boards, and is the author and co-author of fourteen books, eight monographs, over 50 research articles, book reviews, and 12 copy-righted songs.

Charles Smith has received over 50 major awards, including the DuBois Award for scholarship, the Florida A&M University Meritorious Achievement Award in 1975, and the Centennial Medallion in 1987, the NAACP Achievement Award, and the Silver Bell Medallion for service to Mental Health.
