



**CLINTON G. WALLACE**  
**Class of 1974**

**Clinton G. Wallace** was born in LaGrange, Georgia. He graduated from East Depot High School where he lettered in football, baseball and track. Wallace continued his legacy at Tuskegee University as he lettered in two sports—football and track.

A four year letterman, an outstanding fullback at Tuskegee, Wallace was recognized many times for his performance on the football field. His awards and recognitions included: Who's Who Among Outstanding American Athletes (1973), All-Conference Second Team (1973), Most Valuable Player (1973), Most Valuable Offensive Player (1973), Team Co-captain (1973), recipient of the Senior Award, and was named Player of the Week (1971, 1972, 1973, 1974) on several occasions. Wallace was selected to participate in "Free Agent" Camp with the New York Jets and the Houston Oilers in 1973. He also lettered in Track and Field for three years, gaining recognition with the Shot Put, Discus and Javelin.

A leader on and off the field, Wallace was an honor graduate from Tuskegee and was commissioned Second Lieutenant in the United States Air Force in 1974. He has had a distinguished military career ascending to the rank of Colonel. Colonel Wallace has served tours of duty in Minnesota; Republic of the Philippines; Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; and in Okinawa, Japan. He has received numerous military awards and decorations including "Outstanding and Superior Leadership", "Top Performer", and "Exceptionally Qualified".

Colonel Wallace is actively involved in various civic, church, fraternal, academic and government forums at the local, state, national and international levels. He is a motivational speaker, little league football and soccer coach; church youth group director; tiger cub and Cub Scout den leader; member and founder of a local gospel singing group, "Gospel Expressions"; and co-founder of Ecumenical Men Community Service and action organization, Brothers United of Bay County.

Colonel Wallace currently resides in Panama City, Florida and states that "his life has been rewarding mainly due to the nurturing and development received at Tuskegee from his coaches, fellow players, parents, family and friends". Clinton and his wife Paula have two children, Adryan and Clinton, II.
