Dr. David Snead, Detroit, Michigan. Matriculated at Tuskegee after serving three (3) years on active duty in the U.S. Army. He was an All-American Football player at Tuskegee Institute, as well as an Institute Scholar. He participated on the varsity football team for four (4) years, and was a tri-captain of the undefeated SIAC Championship Team in 1967.

He served as statistician for the basketball team and student manager of the track team. He was President of the Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society and President of the Health and Physical Education Majors Club. He was named to Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities.

Dr. Snead received the B.S. degree in Physical Education from Tuskegee Institute with Honors in 1968, a Masters in Urban and Physical Education in 1970 from the University of Michigan, and a Ph.D. in Administration and Supervision from the University of Michigan in 1984.

He taught and coached football, swimming and baseball at Detroit Central High School, winning numerous championships and awards before becoming the school's Department Head of Health, Physical Education, ROTC and Athletics. From there he became a Supervisor of Health and Physical Education for all twenty-two (22) secondary schools in Detroit. Later he was an Assistant Principal in charge of Curriculum and Scheduling in Detroit Osborn High School. David is now Principal of Detroit's Cass Technical High School.

He is a member of the NAACP, his local community (Berg-Lahser) Club, the Executive Board of the Organization of School Administrators and Supervisors - Detroit, the Gamma Lambda Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, the Detroit-Tuskegee Alumni Club, Phi Delta Kappa, the National Association of Secondary School Administrators, and the Metropolitan Detroit Association of Black School Administrators.

Dr. Snead is married, and has three (3) children -- Deborah, David, and Brandon.
