She was a three-time AAU Track All American at Tuskegee, and competed in the Pan Am Games in Argentina as a member of the United States team.

She received the Bachelor of Science degree at Tuskegee, and the Master of Science degree from MacMurray College, Jacksonville, Illinois. She has done further study at Temple University and Concordia University, and has also studied in Germany, Sweden and Denmark.

She has worked as Instructor and Coach at Alabama State University, Miles College in Birmingham, and Carver High School in Birmingham. She has recently retired after 22 years as teacher and coach at Willingboro High School, Willingboro, New Jersey. While there she founded the Willingboro Track Club that has been operating for sixteen years.

Evelyn has made outstanding contributions in the track world, having served as Co-Head Coach of the National Sports Festival East Team in 1982 and Assistant Coach for the same in 1981; Assistant Coach for the Junior National TAC Team in 1985; and is presently serving as TAC National Long Jump Coordinator for the Development of Elite Athletes.

She is involved in many community activities. She is a member of St. Luke's Lutheran Church, the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, the National Education Association, and TAC.

Evelyn and her husband, Bill, have four children who are all outstanding in their chosen professions: Macki, Cleveland, Carol and Carl.
