Mrs. Mitchell, Bronx, New York, was a member of the 1933 through 1937 basketball, tennis and track and field teams at Tuskegee. She was also a member of the "T" Club.

Since graduating from Tuskegee Institute in 1937, Mrs. Mitchell received her master's degree in Physical Education and Recreation from Springfield College (MASS). She has done post graduate work at the School of Social Work and Case Western University and received a Health Education Certificate for four summers' study at Yale.

She is presently Director of the Recreation Program at St. Christopher's Hennie Clarkson Child Care Service, Inc., Dobbs Ferry, New York. She has served as Director of Physical Education for girls and women at Livingstone College, Salisbury, North Carolina; Dixwell Community House, New Haven, Connecticut; and Alabama State Teacher's College, Montgomery, Alabama. Mrs. Mitchell also served as Supervisor of Recreation and Community Activities for Region 5 in the Southeastern United States--Alabama, Georgia, Florida and South Carolina.

She does volunteer work at Montifiore Hospital and the Morning Side Nursing Home. She has organized an inter-agency recreation association with 15 agencies. She received the professional service award from the Westchester County Recreation and Park Society in 1977.

Her membership in professional organizations includes: American Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation; National Association for Physical Education of College Women; Westchester Recreation and Parks Society; Health Education Committee of the Yonkers YWCA; and the NAACP.
