George W. Dickerson, Jr., Indianapolis, Indiana, was a four-year football letterman at Tuskegee from 1946 through 1950. He was All-American in football in 1948.

Dickerson was a standout in 1948 when the Golden Tigers of Tuskegee Institute and the Maroon Tigers of Morehouse College renewed their annual classic in Memorial Stadium, in Columbus, Georgia. His ability to make gains through the line and long run around ends caused him to be listed as one of the outstanding backs in the football history of Tuskegee Institute.

He is a retired U. S. Army Colonel and now serves as Vice Principal of Westlane Junior High School in Indianapolis. He is a member of the executive council of the Boy Scouts of America, Chairman of the Human Relations Committee and Vice President of his Sunday School class. He is a member of the Indiana High School Principals Association. He was a member of the Lawrence Township School Board for two years and served in management analysis for the city of Indianapolis.

He holds a masters degree in Guidance and is a graduate of the Command and General Staff College and National Defense Management School.
