Guy Roye Trammell, Tuskegee Institute, Alabama, played varsity football for five years at Tuskegee, including one year on the college team when he was still in high school. He lettered four years and played three 60-minute games. He was known to his team-mates and classmates as "Speed." He was president of the junior and senior classes, and a major in ROTC.

Trammell was the outstanding student in Mechanical Industries in 1935 and received his B.S. degree in Mechanical Industries in 1936. He received the M.S. degree in industrial education from Bradley University. Trammell served as freshman football coach and assistant varsity coach at Tuskegee.

He is retired and Professor Emeritus Tuskegee Institute after 42 years as teacher and head of the Electrical Construction Division. He served two years as a Teacher-Trainer and Field Group Leader for the Republic of Indonesia. He received three Urban League Summer Fellowships: one with Caterpillar Tractor Company, and two with General Motors.

Trammell was supervisor of intern programs and summer work for students in the school of mechanical industries. He supervised and designed power line construction and maintenance on Tuskegee Institute's campus. He designed electrical work for \$10 million worth of construction in seven states.

He is a member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity; charter and life member of Optimist International; Interfraternal Committee; American Society for Training Managers; Vice Chairman and Committee Chairman of Carver District Boy Scouts of America; Tuskegee Building Commission; Lt. Governor, Zone 4 Optimist International; Secretary of Tuskegee Tiger Club; Licensed Electrical Contractor; and a Tuskegee Institute Presidential Associate. He has traveled extensively--Japan, China, Thailand, Malaya, Indonesia, India, Pakistan, Iraq, Syria, Jordan and Egypt.

He has received the Silver Beaver Award from the Boy Scouts of America, the Outstanding President Award from Optimist International, and the Outstanding Citizen's Award from the City of Tuskegee. He is a member and past president of the Tuskegee Alumni Club.
