



MRS. HATTIE TURNER PALMER

Hattie Turner Palmer, Cincinnati, Ohio, was an outstanding member of the girl's tennis basketball, track and field, field hockey and badminton teams at Tuskegee Institute. She was captain of the Basketball team three years and was commander of the girl's drill team. She had the third highest score in the National Track and Field Events in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania in 1944, and set the javelin throw record in the Tuskegee Institute relays in 1943.

Mrs. Palmer has worked as a playground director in Cincinnati and as a counselor for the Princeton City School District where she helped develop a smooth integration program. She has been coordinator of the Princeton Interracial Club and a member of the board for Foreign Exchange Students, and is owner and operator of Palmer's Driving School and Palmer's Lend-A-Hand.

She is active in sports, playing with the city bowling and golf champions in 1966 and 1967 and was accepted to the Professional Women's Bowling Association in 1967. In 1968 she received the Mary L. Wilkes Award for outstanding contributions to bowling on the national level. She holds a masters in guidance and counseling from Tuskegee Institute.
