



ISAAC SHAW

Isaac Shaw was a three year letterman, linkman and Co-Captain of the Golden Tiger Golf team from 1965-67. Shaw's ability to get the team out of crunch situations earned him the nickname "Sweet Swinging Shaw." In addition to his tenure on the golf course, he was Sports Editor for the Tuskeana in 1967, and president of the College Union Board 1965-66. In 1966-1967 he was awarded the prestigious Robert R. Moton Award and was listed in Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities in 1968.

After graduation in 1968, Shaw continued his connection to the University through the Tuskegee National Alumni Association. Since 1973 he has provided strong leadership at the Local, Regional and National levels. He has served as Club President, First and Second Regional Director, National Recruitment Coordinator, financial secretary, and treasurer. Isaac and his wife Vera, a 1967 graduate, have been instrumental in sending many students to Alma Mater from San Jose, California. Included among the students who came were his daughter Muriel, class of 1995 and his son Isaac, Jr. class of 1997. In addition to his leadership and student recruitment efforts, Isaac understands the need for financial support to Alma Mater as exemplified through his level of giving and continued support. While he and his wife have provided scholarship assistance for students he has to the University a minimum gift of \$1000 per year as a 1000 Plus Eminent Presidential Plus Associate status.

Mr. Shaw has received numerous awards and honors including the Cleve R. Abbot Award, the Distinguished Alumni Service Award, and the "Good Neighbor Award" from the Martin L. King Association of Santa Clara, California. The Shaw's were nominated for this award for their years of community work with youth groups and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.
