James E. Brock, Cincinnati, Ohio, was a member of the Basketball Team from 1946 to 1950. Under the sharp eye of basketball coach Edward Adams, Brock was a starter and continued to receive all SIAC honors for 1949-50, and in 1950 was heralded as the SIAC scoring champion.

Upon graduation from Tuskegee in 1950, Brock began the arduous task of molding the minds and athletic skills of the young men and women in the States of Kentucky and Ohio. Those who came to assist him in his undertaking were the likes of Arthur Ashe, Wayne Embry and Oscar Robertson.

Brock continued in the Tuskegee tradition by winning high school basketball championships and tennis tournaments in the States of Kentucky and Ohio. The first black high school to win a basketball district championship in the State of Kentucky was under his coaching.

Although a retired teacher, coach and athletic director, he continues to be actively involved in community affairs. Brock is a member of the Ohio PTA, Ohio Tennis Coaches Association, Ohio Basketball Association, Glendale Missionary Baptist Church, Black Hall of Fame in Athletics in Northern Kentucky, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity and the Sports Trail Century Club.
