Kelvin Robbins, a native of Birmingham, Alabama; enrolled at Tuskegee University in 2006 on an athletic scholarship. He played outside linebacker and was a four-year letterman. He was a stellar performer on the 2006-2010 football teams that posted a 51-7 record; won four consecutive SIAC Football Championships; and was named 2007 HBCU National Champions with a 12-0 record. This successful run also included three Pioneer Bowl wins in 2006, 2007 and 2009. In 2010, Robbins senior year, he was named Tuskegee's Most Valuable Defensive Player and was selected to play in the HBCU All-Star game where he gained attention from several NFL scouts.

Robbins earned his Bachelors of Science from Tuskegee in 2011, majoring in Business Administration. He was a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity Inc, Gamma Epsilon Chapter and served as chapter president in 2009. Also, he served as a mentor for the Kappa League at Booker T. Washington High School.

Robbins started his professional career in manufacturing for Hormel Foods in Atlanta, GA as a production supervisor and serving on the plant's safety committee to establish safety protocols. Robbins receive a certification in Better Process Control from the University of Georgia's, College of Agricultural in 2017. In 2018, he became a production manager and site safety liaison for Sherwin Williams manufacturing facility. Robbins is currently an Area Manager for the J.M. Smucker in McCalla, AL.

Robbins attends Greater Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church and is actively involved with his community partnering up with organizations such as United Way, food bank of Central Alabama, Kik-start, and local schools. Additionally, he actively works with his fraternity, Kappa Alpha Psi, to help organize clothing and food drives for the homeless shelters in his community. Kelvin volunteers his time coaching girls' soccer at Homewood Soccer Club, where he has had successful undefeated seasons in his first two years as coach. He continues to support Tuskegee University with consistent contributions to the Golden Tiger Fund.
