

KIRBY MCDANIEL Class of 1970

Kirby McDaniel graduated from Booker T. Washington High School, Atlanta, Georgia in 1962. He was named All State High School End and was awarded the Cornell Abbott Swinney Top Athlete Award. His prowess on the playing field continued at Tuskegee as a "Golden Tiger" split- end from 1962 through 1966. In 1964, he was named to the All-Star Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) Squad. Again in 1965, he was recognized for his stellar performance and named to the SIAC All-Conference Squad, the Pittsburg Carrier All-American Team and Small College All-American. This outstanding "Golden Tiger" signed a professional football contract with the San Diego Chargers.

After completing a successful athletic career, Kirby McDaniel spent thirty-three (33) years with Atlanta, Georgia Public Schools as a Technology Educator and Coach. His service went beyond the walls of the school. Mr. McDaniel supports his community through membership and service with the Atlanta Habitat for Humanity, Aid to Children of Imprisoned Mothers, Inc., and Board of Directors of the Anthony Flanagan Recreation Center and many other boards and organizations. He has written and presented numerous articles for the Coaching Clinic, The Champion Coach of the Year Clinic Football Manual, and participating with the National, Athletic Endorsement Services Educational Concepts, LTD. McDaniel is the recipient of many awards and honors including GACA baseball coach of the year and assistant basketball coach of the year and the Atlanta Life coach of the year in 1972. Again in 1973, he was the GACA Coach of the year state champion football and assistant coach of the State Champion Basketball teams.
