

LEON CRENSHAW, SR. Class of 1966

Leon Crenshaw, Sr., Columbus, Georgia, was a member of the Football Team and Track and Field Teams, 1962-1966, and was a four-year Letterman in both sports. He was elected to the All-SIAC Football Team in 1964, and received SIAC honors in 1963 for the Discus Throw. Crenshaw was the first recipient (Most Valuable Player) of the Coca Cola Trophy Awarded in 1964 at the Alabama State/Tuskegee Thanksgiving Classic.

After graduation, Crenshaw became one of the first Tuskegee graduates to play professional football with the Green Bay Packers.

He is currently a member of the faculty at the DeVry Institute of Technology in Atlanta, Georgia.

Crenshaw continues to be an active Church member as well as an active participant with National Education Association, Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers, Boy Scouts, YMCA and Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity.
