LULA HYMES GLENN, '39 - was a member of Tuskegee Institute track teams from 1935-39, a member of the Girls basketball team, and participated in other sports.

Among honors won were member of the Tuskegee Women's Track and Field Team which won the National Championship for four consecutive years. She won the 100 meter at Naugatuck, Connecticut in 12.4 seconds, first in broad jump with a leap of 17 feet 2 inches, and along with her Relay team mates, won the 400 meter run in 52 seconds, winning the Hames M. Roche Trophy

High Point Scorer Women's National and Field Champions, 1938. For several years, Mrs. Glenn held the American broad jump record of 18.1 inches.

After graduation from Tuskegee in 1939, Mrs. Glenn taught Home Economics and Physical Education at Lincoln High School, Atchison, Kansas. She is presently employed at the Veterans Administration Hospital, Tuskegee, Alabama. Among her responsibilities as secretary, she train and orientate new secretaries and volunteer office workers. She has received five outstanding supervisor performance awards.

Mrs. Glenn is active in religious, civic, and social activities in the community. She is married to Mr. Miles A. Glenn, a 1939 Tuskegee graduate.
