Michael Crayton, a mighty Golden Tiger began his athletic career at the South Macon High School, Roba Alabama. He played in the Alabama All-Star game in Tuscaloosa and set records that are still standing. Michael continued his legacy as a "golden tiger" where he played five years. From the position of running back he lettered two years, 1979 and 1980. After graduating from Tuskegee University he played professional football with the Saskatchewan Roughriders in the Canadian football league.
