Nathaniel Frazier, an outstanding athlete, played baseball and basketball at Tuskegee from 1954-58. His basketball talents were second to none. He was leading scorer 1954-55, lettered 1956, 1957 and 1958 and was co-captain of the 1957-58 Golden Tiger Basketball Team.

From the courts and fields at Tuskegee, this mighty Golden Tiger launched an outstanding career as teacher and coach. His professional career spanned from high school teacher/coach/counselor to coach/professor at some of the nation's leading colleges and universities to basketball assistant coach and general manager of semi-professional and professional teams.

Among the positions held are assistant basketball coach, football coach, head track coach and health counselor at Bronx Vocational High School; Coordinator of National Teacher Corp Program at New York University; Director of Teacher Education Program, Delaware State University; Head Basketball Coach and Assistant Professor at Morgan State University; Assistant Coach of the New York Knickerbockers Professional Basketball Team; President of the Baltimore Washington Metro Women's Semi-Professional Basketball Team; and general manager and head coach of the Virginia Waves Women's Semi-Professional Basketball Team.

At Morgan State University, Frazier developed a basketball program which produced a NCAA College Division Championship Team in 1974 and earned him recognition as Associated Press College Division Coach of the Year. This champion was also recognized as outstanding coach and coach of the year by the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, the Sports Boosters of Maryland, the Maryland State Legislature and Venezuela Professional Basketball League.
