OWEN J. DUNCAN, JR., '30 - a former football star and tennis player at Tuskegee. He was named five times to the All-Southern football team, and three times as an All-American. His training, since leaving Tuskegee, includes a M. A. degree from Teacher's College, Columbia University, further study at Harvard University and the University of Chicago.

Mr. Duncan's professional career includes classroom teacher, coach and principal in the public school systems in Oklahoma, North Carolina, and Virginia. In 1969 he was appointed director of Title I Program, Campbell County Schools, Rustburg, Virginia. He retired from the school system June 30, 1970. Recently, Duncan was appointed to the Campbell County School Board, Rustburg, Virginia for a four-year term.

He has served as statistician for Western District Virginia Interscholastic Athletic League, 1945-54; statistician for Western District Interscholastic Association, 1954-70; he also served on the committee to merge the Virginia High School League and the Virginia Interscholastic Association.
