



SOLOMON FRAZIER

Solomon Frazier- teacher, counselor, and coach- distinguished himself as a force to be reckoned with on the court at Tuskegee (Institute) University and throughout the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. A four year letterman, Frazier was selected to the All-Conference First Team in 1963 and 1964, served as captain and leading scorer of the 1963-64 Golden Tiger team, and received the Most Valuable Player Award that same season. Frazier was ranked second in the nation in field percentage (66.3 %) among the NAIA small colleges in 1964.

The outstanding performances that distinguished Frazier at Tuskegee continued throughout his professional career. He was twice selected as coach of the year by the New York City Public School League in 1987 and 1993. This dedicated professional who extended his love for children and the game of basketball, led him to organize an after school basketball league for middle school students. He also served as volunteer coach for the Blue Chip High School Basketball Tournament.

Frazier attributes his success in life to the encouragement and caring support of individuals like Mr. Thomas Hardwick, Jr., his high school Assistant Coach, who inspired him to attend Tuskegee (Institute) University and Coach Ross C. Owens for his calming effect and belief in him as a person.
