



**Sylvester ‘Nunnie’ Robinson**  
Class of 1969

Sylvester Robinson, a Brookhaven, Mississippi native, is a 1965 graduate of Alexander High School. He enrolled in Tuskegee in the summer of 1965, lettering 4 years in football as a quarterback. He was a member of the 1967 undefeated team and was named to the B-Division All-Conference team in 1968. He had a brief tryout as a free agent with the Atlanta Falcons.

Mr. Robinson graduated from Tuskegee in 1969, majoring in English Education. He made the Dean’s List as a junior and senior, was a member of the Little Theatre and was politically active during the turbulent period of the 60s. In 1987, he earned a master’s degree in Educational Leadership from Nova University in Davie, FL.

Mr. Robinson began his professional career as a teacher, coach and administrator in Broward County (Ft. Lauderdale), a career spanning some 43 years. He currently serves as sports editor and proofreader for the Westside Gazette, a minority, family-owned newspaper established in 1971 by his father-in-law, Mr. Levi Henry, Jr. Additionally, “The Nunnie Robinson Show,” a local cable sports program featuring journalism students and star athletes discussing highlights of the previous week’s game, while implementing video as a visual and scouting tool, was named after him.

Mr. Robinson is an active member of Mt. Hermon AME Church, Ft. Lauderdale, where he serves on the Steward Board, the Finance Committee, as a Class Leader and is a member of the Sons of Allen. Mr. Robinson is also a proud member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.

Mr. Robinson is most proud of his work in the revitalization and restructuring of the South Florida Tuskegee Alumni Club (SFTAC), representing Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach Counties. He has served as president, has attended TNAA biennial meetings, and is a member of the Tuskegee Golden Tigers Athletic Association. He has consistently contributed financially to Tuskegee’s annual fundraising efforts.

Mr. Robinson and his wife Sonia are the proud parents of 3 children, 7 grandchildren and one great grandchild. He and his wife currently reside in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida.
