Theresa B. Adams Garner, Grambling, Louisiana, played basketball and tennis at Tuskegee Institute from 1927 through 1931. She lettered in basketball for four years and received four gold basketball awards.

Since graduating from Tuskegee in 1931, she has been a teacher in Louisiana, North Carolina and Tuscaloosa, Alabama. She was school supervisor in Georgia from 1934 to 1939 and school supervisor, Lincoln Parish, Louisiana from 1939 through 1970.

Mrs. Garner is a member of the Louisiana and National Education Association, the American Association for Curriculum Development and the Southern Education Foundation. Her parents were the founders of Grambling State University and her grandfather was the late Lewis Adams, who helped found Tuskegee Institute.
