Thomas R. Grant, a native of Cleveland, Ohio, arrived at Tuskegee Institute in 1978 as a walk-on track athlete, but quickly earned a scholarship for his remaining three years. As a 400-800-1600-meter runner on the track team, Grant lettered all 4-years and was named All-SIAC several seasons. Additionally, he was a NCAA Honorable Mention in 1980; Division II Champion and All-American in 1981; and All-American in 1982. In 1981, Grant was a member of the Tuskegee Men's 1600-Meter Relay Team (consisting of James Turner, Floyd Johnson, Thomas Grant and John Sanders) who won the NCAA Division II National title at Western Illinois University.

Grant majored in Business Administration and followed his father, Joseph Grant – Tuskegee Class of 1956, as a consistent performer in the classroom. He was active in campus life as a resident dorm assistant; assisted in Chapel Services with set-up and breakdown of homecoming venues. He also assisted Mayor Johnny Ford in organizing city runs during the Tuskegee Relays. Grant earned his Bachelor of Science from Tuskegee University (Institute) in 1983.

After graduating from Tuskegee, Grant has held several Management and Leadership titles including stints at Home Depot (Assistant Manager), handling clients such as Siemens at New Breed Logistics (now GXO Logistics). He is currently employed with Boeing Aircraft.

Grant is active in the community through his Masonic organization and his local church. He supports the Tuskegee General Fund and Skegee Golden Tigers Book Scholarship Fundraiser.

Grant currently reside in Jonesboro Georgia. He has three children: a son Thomas Joseph (Tuskegee - Class of 2011) Jonesboro, Ga., and twin girls Ashley and Ariel Martin of Cleveland, Ohio.
