William McKinley Lewis participated in football and track while at Tuskegee. He was selected All-SIAC in 1950, and was co-captain of the football team in 1951.

After receiving the B.S. degree from Tuskegee, he received the Master of Science degree from Central Michigan University, and has done further study at Rutgers University in Political Science.

For the past fifteen years, Lewis has been head track and field coach at John F. Kennedy High School, Willingboro, New Jersey. He is a member of the Masters Officials Association on the national level, and has also officiated at the National Sports Festival in 1981. He was Head Coach of the Women's East Team, National Sports Festival, 1982. Prior to these affiliations, he was Assistant Football Coach at Alabama State University, 1953-54.

Lewis is presently one of the coaches of the Elite National Team for TAC Athletic Congress, 1985-86, and Group Representative for the Olympics for 1988.

He is active in religious, civic and social activities in his community through membership in St. Luke's Lutheran Church; member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, the National Education Association, and TAC.

The Lewises are the proud parents of three boys and one girl --- Macki, Cleveland (the first born named after Major Abbott after his death), Carol, and Carl.
